Providence Township Parks/Recreation Committee Meeting September 10, 2020 7:00

The regular meeting of the Providence Township Parks/Recreation Committee was held in the township municipal office on Thursday September 10, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. Present were Providence Township Supervisors John Schroeder and Lori Crossen, Committee Members Roy Snyder, Frank Voynar, Korlene Calkins, and Chris Harnish. There were 7 observers.

Ryan Vanover was present along with his father Ray Vanover. Ryan presented his idea for an Eagle Scout project to the group. He is interested in installing a bicycle repair station on the trail. There currently is a station at Lancaster Central Market and also at Cape Henlopen State Park in Delaware. The station must be bolted into concrete. It was suggested that possibly the cement could be donated. The approximate cost is \$1,500.00. Ryan would like to do this project before cold weather. His Eagle Scout project must be completed by April. Ryan will present his project at the September 14th Board of Supervisors meeting.

In the absence of Chairman Brian Longenecker, Chris Harnish led the meeting. She shared a map with everyone that Brian created (Equine Remediation Study). This map traces the path that was taken during a trial horseback ride. The map shows areas of conflict, areas where riders cannot stay on the side of the trail, and addresses other issues. Everyone agreed that Brian did an excellent job with this map.

Lillian Bason had concerns with the bridges over Lime Street and Church Street. The railings are wooden and she felt they were a safety issue. John Schroeder stated that funds are available in the Parks/Recreation budget that could be used for horse signage. He also reminded everyone that someone volunteered to bring in fill for the side of the trail.
