Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting May 12, 2022 7:00 p.m.

The regular meeting of the Providence Township Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting was held in the township municipal office on Thursday, May 12, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. Present were Township Manager Vicki Eldridge, Committee Members, Marla Davis, Chris Harnish, Robert Kaschak, Bill Musser, Roy Snyder, Frank Voyner, Warren Walter and one (1) observer.

The Township Manager opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. Mrs. Eldridge gave an update on the trail corridor from Manor Township to Bart Township.

Mrs. Eldridge stated that a trail user informed the township that the bike repair station at the Sigman Road Trailhead was vandalized. The air pump handle was missing. The part was ordered and is ready to be replaced. Frank Voyner volunteered to repair the equipment.

Bill Musser mentioned trail users would like to see an additional portable toilet on the western portion of the trail.

Scott Peiffer reviewed the plans Quarryville Borough is working through to have access to and from the trail in the Borough.

Committee members mentioned it would be nice to have bike racks at the trailheads. Bill Musser shared a picture of a log bike rack that would not cost anything to install.

Mrs. Eldridge informed the committee that the township has received a \$5,000 grant from the Lancaster Bicycle Club. Following discussion for the use of the grant, it was decided to use these funds to build a kiosk at the East State Street Trailhead. Any funds remaining could be used for signage, or shade stations. The committee would like to see picnic tables in some areas such as Sigman Trailhead.

Those committee members that frequent the trail mentioned that the trail surface is in good condition.

Bill Musser asked if there was an agreement in place that would allow for the same rules throughout the trail.

With no other business to transact, the meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
