Returning Taxpayer Investment

As a state lawmaker, one of the most important things I do is finding ways to get our taxpayer dollars reinvested in our community.



Recently, the bipartisan Commonwealth Financing Authority, which is part of the Department of Community and Economic Development, approved a grant my office advocated for that would support an ongoing manhole and interceptor relining project in Quarryville Borough and Providence Township.

This \$680,000 grant was requested by the Quarryville Borough Authority to help with an ongoing water drainage infrastructure project in both Quarryville Borough and New Providence in Providence Township. The funding for this project will allow for relining 11 existing brick manholes and approximately 2,770 linear feet of the existing 8-inch transite interceptors located between 2350 Old Road, New Providence, and 368 Camargo Road, Quarryville.

The ability to return taxpayer investment into the Commonwealth back to our local communities is an important part of the work lawmakers do in Harrisburg. I am proud to be able to secure this critical funding for Providence Township to enhance local infrastructure and ensure our community has the resources it needs to thrive.

That is why I was also proud to announce a Fire and Emergency Medical Services Grant of \$15,979 that helped Quarryville Fire Company, which serves Providence Township. This is funding that comes from the proceeds from slot machine gaming, and not General Fund tax revenue.

Our fire and EMS personnel are the backbone of our community, and they sacrifice their lives and well-being to help their neighbors. Providing state investment into these critical community assets helps ensure they have what they need to be prepared to take on the tough job of keeping our communities safe.

<u>Recycling, Trash Collection</u> <u>and Open Burning</u>

Did you know that in Providence Township a resident is required to recycle? Do you think recycling is confusing? Do not worry, we have the answers for you. Yes, Providence Township residents and businesses are required to recycle because Providence Township is an Act 101 mandated municipality since 1992. This is based on the population of the municipality. Recycling in Lancaster County was made simpler in 2018 with the change to the BIG 4.

The BIG 4 items are as follows:

- corrugated cardboard
- plastic bottles and jugs with necks
- metal food and beverage cans
- glass jars and bottles.

All other items do not belong in your recycling bin. When in doubt, throw it out. For more information on recycling, you can visit <u>www.lcswma.org</u>. Providence Township does not collect your trash, trash collection is done through licensed private haulers for residents and businesses.

Reminder to residents and businesses in the township open burning is regulated within the township. No person within Providence Township shall ignite or feed any open fire for the destruction of refuse or in the conduct of a salvage operation in any public or private place outside any building; or, cause, suffer, allow or permit the maintenance of any open fire for the destruction of refuse, or in the conduct of salvage operation on any property under his control outside of any building. Refuse is defined as garbage, rubbish and trade waste.
