Springtime Zoning Information & Reminders

Warm weather is soon upon us, bringing with it, the construction season. A few reminders regarding permitting and zoning requirements as we enter spring:

- Pools (even inflatable pools or pools purchased at a department store) require zoning/building permits if the sides of the pool are 24" in height or greater.
- Permits are required for sheds, decks, patios and other accessory structures. Structures creating new impervious surface are subject to stormwater management requirements. These projects require an application for stormwater management or stormwater exemption. (Decks constitute impervious surface and would be subject to stormwater management requirements.)
- The Zoning Ordinance prohibits unregistered and uninspected vehicles on a property unless kept within a completely enclosed structure. The Ordinance requires all vehicles on a property not in an enclosed structure to be properly licensed.
- If you have questions regarding permitting for a proposed project, please feel free to contact me. Please keep in mind that construction without appropriate permits will result in additional permit fees and costs.

FARMLAND PRESERVATION FUNDING

The Commissioners also approved the County's portion of funding for the Agriculture Preservation Program. The Commissioners will allocate \$1,741,311.00 towards Farmland Preservation in 2025. This is just Lancaster County's portion and allows for the County to receive additional funding through the PA Bureau of Farmland Preservation based on their funding formula. For 2025, the County anticipates receiving between \$2.5 to \$3 million in state funding. The funds will go towards preserving farms on the County's ranked preservation list, which currently has over 150 farms who have applied.

ENOLA LOW GRADE TRAIL, Spring has sprung! Time to get out onto the Enola Low Grade Trail! You can now ride the trail from the start of the Manor Trail in Manor Township to Bart Township! The remaining trail improvements in Bart and Sadsbury Townships are expected to be completed by 2026. Recycling, Trash Collection

Did you know that in Providence Township a resident is required to recycle? Do you think recycling is confusing? Do not worry, we have the answers for you. Yes, Providence Township residents and businesses are required to recycle because Providence Township is an Act 101 mandated municipality since 1992. This is based on the population of the municipality. Recycling in Lancaster County was made simpler in 2018 with the change to the BIG 4. The BIG 4 items are corrugated cardboard, plastic bottles and jugs with necks, metal food and beverage cans and glass jars and bottles. All other items do not belong in your recycling bin. When in doubt, throw it out. Providence Township does not collect your trash, trash collection is done through a private hauler for residents and businesses. The private haulers must be licensed in the township and renew these licenses annually. Currently, there are Five (5) licensed trash haulers in the township; B & L Carson Disposal LLC, Cauler Containers, Econ LLC, Republic Services of PA LLC and Waste Management of PA. Please contact your trash hauler to make special arrangements for large items or for items that would not normally be included in your curbside trash. Providence Township holds two (2) wood yard waste days for drop-off at the township building. Refer to the article in this edition pertaining to that collection for further information.

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
